ADMINISTRATION & STAFF

CHRIS TRACZ



Chris Tracz is in his third season as the head coach at Marist College. In his first two seasons at the helm, the Red Foxes have compiled a record of 68-39 (.636 winning percentage). In 2011, Marist won 35 games, the second-highest total in program history. The Red Foxes also had five all-conference selections, including three first team selections. In his pitching career at Marist, Tracz helped the Red Foxes to three NCAA Tournament Appearances in 2001, 2002 and 2005 as a player. He is Marist's all time leader in strikeouts (298), wins (38) and innings pitched (379.1). During Tracz's playing career he was a Louisville Slugger and Baseball America Freshman All-American, as well as the 2001 MAAC Rookie of the Year, and the 2002 and 2005 MAAC Pitcher of the Year.

THOMAS SEAY



Thomas Seay is in his second season as assistant baseball coach at Marist, and is in charge of the program's recruiting efforts. Seay's responsibilities include working with the infield and outfield defense, as well as the team's hitters. He had most recently served as assistant coach/recruiting coordinator at Young Harris College. In his first recruiting class, he brought in 28 players from nine different states. Seay was assistant coach/recruiting coordinator at Slippery Rock University for the 2008 and 2009 seasons. In 2006 and 2007, Seay was a volunteer assistant at Old Dominion University.

JUSTIN HAYWOOD



Justin Haywood is in his first season as an assistant coach at Marist. Haywood's on-field responsibilities include working with the team's catchers and hitters. Prior to coming to Marist, Haywood served as volunteer assistant coach at Old Dominion for the 2011 season. He worked primarily with the catchers, outfielders and hitters, and coached Freshman All-American Joey Burney. In 2009, Haywood performed duties as assistant administrator for the USA Collegiate National team that won the World Baseball Challenge. As a student-athlete, Haywood played for four years at the University of Louisville as a catcher.

PROGRAM FEATURES

CAMP PHILOSOPHY

- The camp will focus on all areas of the game (offense, defense, pitching catching, basic throwing, fielding, base running, etc.). The purpose is to improve together as a group nurturing specific baseball skills and develop a better understanding of the game. This is fostered through game situations, competition games, individual skill work and team fundamentals. Game and skill work is centered around a team approach and use team building exercises to incorporate all campers into activities.

ELIGIBILITY

- Ages 7-12 may attend or up until the completion of the eighth grade.
- Players will be grouped in divisions based on age and ability:

EQUIPMENT NEEDED

- Baseball glove, bat, hat, rubber soled shoes or sneakers (general baseball attire).
- Catchers' equipment will be provided.
- We are not responsible for lost items.

LUNCH

- Players are encouraged to bring their own bag lunch and drink to be refrigerated on campus. Campers will also be able to order and purchase pizza by the slice and drinks. Water will be provided on each field throughout the duration of camp.

REGISTRATION

- \$225 per session (Five days in length)
- Includes five days of instruction (9 a.m. - 3:30 p.m.), certificate of participation and a MARIST COLLEGE T-SHIRT.
- A \$75 non-refundable deposit is due with the application.
- Balances are due before the start of camp.
- Campers will receive written notice and medical information forms that must be completed prior to the beginning of each session.

- A certified athletic trainer will be on site during camp hours to attend to any medical issues.
